2025 Annual Conference

Call for Session Proposals

Youth Healthcare Alliance's annual conference brings together school-based clinic providers, managers, staff, and partners to learn with and from each other. Our 2025 conference will be held in-person in Denver, Colorado on April 30 - May 1, 2025 (preconference will be on April 29). It presents an opportunity for those working at the intersection of healthcare and education to network, collaborate, and increase skills.

This year's theme is "Cultivating Strength in Our Communities," with the idea in mind that many changes are happening currently and will continue to happen in Colorado's healthcare system, which will bring many new developments in pediatric and adolescent healthcare. This conference will allow us the space to unpack many of these different issues, while recognizing that we have the capability to seize opportunities and manage change effectively.

We are seeking speakers to present on topics connected to the conference theme that relate to the work and needs of school-based clinics and the youth they serve. We encourage submissions that include school-based clinic staff and youth perspectives and will give priority to presenters who are new to sharing at our conference. If you have presented at this conference within the past three years, please ensure this year's proposal is distinct from topics you have previously covered. We are especially interested in sessions focused on the topics below, which our membership has expressed interest in learning more about this year.

Adolescent and pediatric health care delivery

- Integration of care (behavioral health, primary care, and oral health services)
- Addressing substance use (vaping, marijuana, opioids, alcohol, etc.)
- Reproductive care considerations (best practices, inclusive services, STIs, family planning, anticipatory guidance, education)
- Assessing and responding to social drivers of health (food, housing, transportation)
- Application of trauma-informed care inclusive of healing-centered engagement

School-based clinic operations

- Financing a school-based clinic and payment models
- Understanding and navigating minor consent, HIPAA, and FERPA
- Messaging and promoting school-based services
- Landscape for Medicaid (enrollment, ACC 3.0, integrated care changes, etc.)
- Collaborating with schools (IEPs/504 support, asthma plans, wellness initiatives, interdisciplinary meetings etc.)

Engagement

- Youth development and engagement
- Parent/family engagement strategies
- Relationship building, including schools, districts, and community partners
- Expanding services / opening new school-based clinics
